Thank you for offering to visit a cemetery/memorial and deliver a Thame Remembers Cross. This is a novel way for Thame to commemorate the centenary of WW1 and to remember the debt we all owe to those have died during conflict.

We will be accepting offers from 1 July 2014, although only those from relatives will be processed during the first three months. If there is more than one offer to visit any one grave we will need to consider all offers and to accept the one that gives the most beneficial reason for the visit.

We will provide you with details of the location of the cemetery and the grave of the person to whom you have chosen to deliver the cross. How you get to the cemetery will be up to your own initiative. All we ask is that the delivery is carried out with respect for the memory of those who died.

Crosses should be placed central on the appropriate grave in front of the headstone.

Where a name is only remembered on a memorial we ask that a wreath is placed at the memorial and where possible a cross is placed on the grave of an un-named serviceman close by, ideally from the appropriate regiment.

We ask that you make a photographic record of the placement with at least photographs of;

- the cemetery/memorial and your visitor party
- the cross at the grave or memorial
- the person placing the cross and/or wreath
- your record in the cemetery/ memorial visitor book.

On your return you will receive a certificate recording your accomplishment. A copy of the certificate and your photographs will be placed in albums which will be kept for posterity.

Some of the cemeteries are in areas remote from holiday destinations. We will provide financial help to get from your holiday or business area to a memorial or cemetery. In this instance you must obtain a receipt (either public transport ticket or taxi fare receipt). Car travel costs repayment will be calculated at 40p per mile. In all instances the maximum that we can pay is; £40 per overseas visit and £25 per UK visit.

You must carry adequate personal travel insurance for the journey that you are undertaking.
